- 1) What principles or insights from Sunday's sermon did you find to be
 - a. most helpful,
 - b. most challenging,

- 2) Take a few minutes to review Genesis 1:31 and 2:25. Discuss some of the things Genesis chapters 1 and 2 teach us about God's goodness and generosity.

- 3) In Sunday's sermon Pastor Kurt suggested that Ezekiel 28:11-19 and Isaiah 14:10-17 are descriptions of Satan's pre-fallen splendor. Beyond the extraordinary language of these passages, Pastor Kurt offered that Daniel 10:8-14, as well as Ephesians 6:12, support this view. Read each of these passages and discuss what we learn about how God originally created Lucifer and possible reasons why he fell from glory.

- 4) In light of Genesis 3:1's introduction of evil into the Garden of God, discuss the following quote by Norman Geisler.

**“God is morally accountable for giving the good thing called
freewill, but He is not morally responsible for all the evil we do with
our freewill.”**

- 5) What do the following verses tell us about Satan and his maleficent activities in a believer's life? 1 Peter 5:8, Matthew 4:3, 1 Thessalonians 3:5, 2 Corinthians 2:11, 2 Corinthians 11:14, Matthew 16:21-23, and most importantly 1 John 4:4.
