**3)** Read the following quote and discuss why God "rested...from all the work which He had done?" (See verse 2:2)

The creation drama does not flow on in ceaseless activity. Creation moves toward rest. This "rest" is not the rest of one who is exhausted. Creation rest describes the rest of one who is satisfied, one who looks at the world saying, "Behold, it is very good." To talk about God at rest is to talk about a loving God. Never ceasing, never satisfied, never finding time for any creature does not characterize a loving God.

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**4)** Read the Ten Commandments from Deuteronomy 5:6-21 and discuss which of the Commandments you feel are not applicable to the New Testament Church, which is not under the covenant of law keeping but the covenant of grace.

5) Discuss the benefits of keeping a Sabbath Day of rest in the rhythm of your life.

6) What place should we give corporate worship to our Sabbath day of rest?
